Dear Families,

I don't want to speak too soon but there are definite signs of Spring in the air, the sun is even putting in an appearance today. I am hoping that the predicted white Easter doesn't become a reality and that we can all enjoy some warming sunshine. The children are already making the most of the weather with great outdoor learning including a wonderful café in Foxes class, serving some rather delicious looking sticks, leaves and mud. Yummy!

New Writing Philosophy:

Each year in our School Development Plan we aim to focus on a different area of our curriculum, this year we have selected writing as our priority and as staff we have worked together to implement a new writing philosophy from Nursery to Year 2.

It has been great to watch the nursery become such an established part of the school and it was great fun to work as part of a much bigger team on our first formal collaboration.

We are basing this project on the importance of story as, time and time again, research indicates that children who hear and later read and engage with narrative do better in all aspects of the curriculum. The use of oral storytelling in particular seems to instil in children a love of language and patterning that will serve them well throughout their time at school and into adulthood.

Each unit of literacy planning will now last three weeks to give children a real chance to get to grips with new books and genres. Each unit will include the following elements:

Imitation – the chance to get immersed in story, by heart, to re-tell it, to act it out, to ask and answer questions, play at it in role play areas and to map it out using story maps.

Invention – the opportunity to play with a story, to re-tell it in your own words, to repeat it and embellish it and to write or tell your own version of it.

Innovation – writing your own stories based on all you have learnt.

Alongside this new method run our already established spelling, punctuation and grammar inputs and daily phonics.

Year Two have trialled one unit, which began last week, and we have already seen the impact on their writing. Year One, Reception and the Nursery will begin their first unit after Easter.

RED TED:

I am now seeing RED TEDs everywhere – he is fast becoming a firm favourite with the children and many of our volunteer reading helpers have commented on the how enthusiastic the children are about him. Thank you for your support with this.

At the moment some children are completing a book within a fortnight and others continue to not read at all. We will present the awards in Friday assembly when there is a group of children who have completed their book.
