Dear Families,

The school is incredibly busy at the moment and there just doesn't seem to be enough time to fit in all that we need to in such a short term. All the staff and most importantly the children are working hard and are making tremendous progress.

Just this term we received confirmation of our results for 2016. These results reflect the academic attainment, in reading, writing and mathematics, of the children that left Shere last year. I am very pleased to report that our children did incredibly well with results that put Shere Infant School in the top 10% of high performing schools in the country in all subjects.

I attribute this success to a number of factors and primarily to a team of excellent and highly experienced teachers who ensure that effective teaching and learning takes place every day. In addition, our highly effective curriculum ensures that children are engaged in exciting play based lessons that are age appropriate and fun. I would also like to highlight the hard work and commitment that we see from the children day in day out.

Our mastery curriculum model has also ensured that children exceeding the expected standard are well above other schools nationally and locally.

### Assessment Tracking:

This week I have been working with Zoe Wood, in her role as School Governor, to track the assessment of our current children. We are keen to track progress at very regular intervals throughout each term to ensure we are pitching our teaching correctly and intervening if any child is struggling in a particular area. Our data shows that children in all classes and in the nursery are making very good progress in all subject areas and we are pleased to note that children receiving intervention are also doing really well.

### Parent Governors:

You will have received a letter at the beginning of the week asking for nominations for the role of parent governor. Many of you have expressed an interest in the strategic direction of the school and I know that our parent body is filled with highly experienced people with a lot to offer. Being on the Board of Governors is a really good way of being involved in the decision making processes of the school and learning from the inside how educational establishments run.

Our new governor really needs to come from the parent body so that parents are represented effectively as stakeholders in our school. Nursery parents as well as those in the school are very welcome to apply. If you would like to have a chat about the role please do come and see me.
