## Gomshall Lane:

**A REPEAT OF YESTERDAY'S PARENTMAIL FOR THOSE WHO MISSED IT:** Once again, I feel I must alert you all to the dangerous parking and driving taking place outside school each morning. I do understand that with builders vans taking up more room it is more challenging to find a space however parking that puts pedestrians and especially children at risk is unacceptable.

1. Please **do not park in the disabled bay** unless you are authorised to do so.
2. **Do not park on or opposite the yellow zig-zags**, or the disabled bay; this is so dangerous as it blocks the road causing buses and lorries to mount the pavement.
3. If you use Kinghams car park **please do not walk through the restaurant's garden** area where people are trying to enjoy a relaxing meal. The team at Kinghams were forced to place chairs across the path yesterday; please respect our neighbours!
4. The speed limit in **Gomshall Lane is 20mph**, please keep your speed down!
5. Do not block driveways or pavements.

This morning I walked over to the **village car park** to see an abundance of spaces available. If you can use this facility it will make Gomshall Lane much safer for all.

I have contacted Surrey Police today for advice on repeat offenders and have been advised to send photographic evidence and number plates. Clearly I do not relish the idea of this, **however I will take action for the safety of the children in the school.**

## Internet Safety:

I am sure that you are all aware of the recent stories concerning the Momo Challenge. After a bit of digging this story does appear to have been rather exaggerated by the press and actual incidents of this happening seem to be limited. However, it has once again raised the profile of our children's safety online and the steps we need to take, or better still encourage children to take, in order to have a happy and safe experience.

At Shere we talk about the 'uh oh' feeling. When children feel uncomfortable or scared in any situation we encourage them to tell a grown up that they trust. Our learners are still so young and we need to offer a considered and age appropriate approach to their online safety. You can help by talking about the 'uh oh' feeling at home.

## Playful Learning:

Hedgehog's classroom is being transformed in light of our increasingly playful curriculum. Time and again research highlights the importance of play in healthy child development, playful learning is deep learning and will give our children skills, knowledge, values and learning behaviours that will enable them to thrive. Huge thanks to all those who have worked so hard to make this room work so wonderfully for our children.
