### RED TED

Last year we reviewed our homework policy. As an evidence based school, we were careful to review the available research to guide our decisions. It was clear that homework made very little impact on infant aged children in terms of their academic achievement and progress. We were also very aware of the limited time some families get to spend together and so as a staff we came to the conclusion that children would gain far greater benefits from quality time at home rather than endless homework tasks.

The one exception to our no homework policy is reading. Reading every-day is the one task that will bring huge benefits now and in the future. Therefore, we expect children to read to an adult every day at home. This read should be recorded in their reading diary in positive terms so that we can keep track on how children are getting on.

After half term, we will publish our first Red Ted reading challenge book for all children in the school. The book contains a number of challenges that children can work through during the half term until Christmas. RED TED stands for read every day, talk every day and the challenges promote home reading and dialogue. Red Ted was very well received last year and we are looking forward to running this again with the children.

### School Uniform:

Shere School and Fox Cubs have a clear uniform policy designed to ensure children look smart whilst being dressed practically for our active curriculum. Practical clothes are particularly important in the Foundation Unit (Reception Class and Nursery), because the curriculum for this stage involves active, messy, outdoor play. Whilst it is tempting to want to buy 'traditional school uniform' for your child it really is not in their best interests and can hinder their activity and progress. Our expectations were clearly stated in the transition documents, at the new entrant's meeting and at home visit. **Please ensure your child is dressed appropriately.**
